Tutorial 10

(Gradient ramps; Calligraphy brush)

Make a new empty Image

>File >New

>Custom Document

1600x1600

>Create

Use the Gradient tool

A “gradient” is a gradual transition from one color to another

Also sometimes called a “ramp”

Krita's gradient will go from the current color to no color
(i.e, to transparent)

Choose a color

in *Color Selector* docket

Gradient tool icon is the little square next to eyedropper icon

Click to select *Gradient* icon



In your blank canvas,

click near edge

and drag toward center

It makes a ramp from current color to transparent

Choose a different color

Click and drag to make a new ramp/gradient

You now have two gradients
on the same layer

Gradient within a Selection area

Make a new layer

Choose one of the dotted-line *Selection* icons

e.g., square or circle, etc

to make a selection

Choose a new color

Choose the *Gradient* tool again

Click & drag within your selection area

The new gradient ramp is only within that selection area

(Gradient ramps; Calligraphy brush)

Calligraphy tool

A calligraphy pen
has a straight-edged tip
to get special effects

Choose a new color
in the Color Selector

Choose the *Calligraphy* tool icon
– little pen tip icon



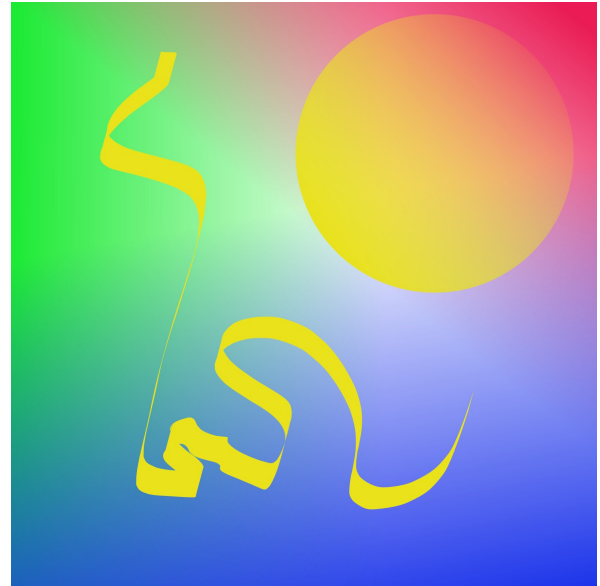
Click and drag in the canvas
Thickness of the stroke varies

This tool makes a new “Vector Layer” layer
just above your currently selected layer

To change settings for *Calligraphy* tool
go to Tool Options docket

If you don't see *Tool Options*,
>Window >Workspace >Big Paint

Tool Options will be at bottom right of screen
